Eagles are the largest kind of raptor. They are dark colored and have round wings.

Eagles often "soar," beating their wings only rarely.

Golden Eagle



Dark brown in color,
with gold markings on
tail and head

- 30 inches long
- 80 inch wingspan

Golden eagles eat hares, squirrels, prairie dogs, and even livestock

Bald Eagle

 Dark brown in color, with white head, neck, and tail

- ✓ 30 inches long
- 🛷 80 inch wingspan

Bald eagles mostly eat fish, but will hunt any small animal available.





Hawks are light in color and have round wings. When they fly, hawks will soar for a while, only beating their wings when they need to.

Red-Tailed Hawk

 Brown on outside of wings, white on underside and stomach

- 23 inches long
- 🖌 🐔 85 inch wingspan

Red-tailed hawks eat small animals like rats, rabbits, and voles.

Red-Shouldered Hawk

Golden in color,with brown markings

- 20 inches long
- 🛹 40 inch wingspan

Red-tailed hawks eat small animals like rats, rabbits, and voles.

Falcons



Falcons are the smallest kind of raptor. They can be any color and have pointed wings.

Falcons flap their wings steadily as they fly.

American Kestrel

 Gray, brown, and tan with black markings and a small beak

11 inches long

🛛 🖪 22 inch wingspan

American kestrels eat insects, rodents, lizards, and small birds.

Peregrine Falcon

Dark brown back
with a white belly and
brown markings

- 17 inches long
- 42 inch wingspan

Peregrine falcons eat other birds, as well as bats.





Owls are raptors that hunt at night. They have large eyes and fly low to the ground.

Barred Owl



Light brown in color
with white markings
and a white face
18 inches long
41 inch wingspan

Bared owls eat squirrels, chipmunks, mice, rabbits, and small birds

Great Horned Owl

Brown and white with two feathery "horns" on the top of head

- 22 inches long
- 45 inch wingspan

Peregrine falcons eat other birds, as well as bats.



There are many birds that are omnivores or herbivores.

They are often smaller than raptors and hop instead of step.

Tufted Titmouse

Gray head and
wings, light belly, and
rusty sides
6 inches long
9 inch wingspan

Tufted Titmice eat insects, seeds, nuts, and berries.

Eastern Towhee

 Black head and wings, red and white belly

- ◀ 7.5 inches long
- 9 inch wingspan

Towhees eat seeds, fruits, insects, spiders, snails, and soft leaves, and flower buds.
