

SETI Tours — 2.5 hours, \$40/pp

Celebrate Green Bank's historic role in the Search for Extraterrestrial Intelligence! We begin where it all started, in the control room of the 85-ft Telescope used by Frank Drake in the original search, "Project Ozma." From there, enjoy rare admittance to the 140-foot telescope, where Jill Tarter's Project Phoenix took place, and then on to restricted GBT access points. The tour concludes in a conversation with a staff astronomer about the future of SETI and the role of the GBT in the Breakthrough Listen project.
